Website Updates

We have just added some extra features to the website, including:

- An extended toolkit of more collective actions for local groups and councils
- Links to climate and environmental networks around the country
- New registration for community groups, town & parish councils, and businesses

We are also developing digital mapping with Parish Online, an online discussion forum organised by county and by topic, and a searchable knowledgebase.

Great Collaboration in East Anglia

<u>Northants RAIN Gardens</u> helps the residents of Harpers Brook and Wootton Brook to set up rain gardens for free. The gardens reduce surface water and boost local habitats. The organisation works with communities to implement flood resilience through a holistic approach.
